A forensic pathologist punched holes in the story that Catherine Novak was strangled by murder....Charles Wetli, a former Suffolk county chief medical examiner, and now highly paid defense witness, said Catherine's body showed no of the telltale signs of strangulation. "You don't have any evidence of cause of death,"....Wetli agreed with forensic pathologist who testified that Catherine was died before the fire broke out noting carbon monoxide levels were minimal and she hadn't breathed in any soot. But, Wetli said the cause of death can't be determined.
